This week we welcomed our students back for Term 3. Term 3 is usually a very busy term for staff and students.

This week, our Year 8 students had their Retreat day led by the Passionists – Claire and Patrick. The Year 8 students spent their day focusing on who they are as a person as well as the relationships around them as a group. They learnt the importance of trust, what builds and what breaks trust. They spent time determining what sort of group they wish to be and how to strengthen relationships.
